The Grand Jurors of the United States of America, duly selected, empaneled, sworn and charged to inquire in and for the body of the Western District of Arkansas, aforesaid, upon their oath present:

THAT

William Curry a white man and not an Indian

on the 1 day of July A. D. 1895 at the County of Baxter State of Arkansas in the Indian Country, within the Western District of Arkansas, aforesaid,

illegally, feloniously knowingly sell whiskey to John Hill an Indian in the charge and under the supervision of the United States Indian agent for the five civil and tribe of Indians

contrary to the form of the Statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace and dignity of the United States of America.
