Thomas Jefferson was an American statesman, diplomat, lawyer, architect, philosopher, and Founding Father who served as the third president of the United States from 1801 to 1809. He had previously served as the second vice president of the United States under John Adams between 1797 and 1801. He was the principal author of the Declaration of Independence.

This collection consists of three letters and two notes from Thomas Jefferson (one is a photocopy), one note from "Randolph Monticello," and a sample of flax spun by Col. David Campbell's mother.
