I do solemnly swear that the above account is correct in each and every particular; that the services and travel therein charged were rendered on the dates as given by me and therein stated; that all meals for prisoners therein charged for were furnished by me, and actually cost the sums charged in each case; that the guards named were necessary and performed the service as stated in their several certificates; that all expenses to arrest were actually necessary in serving the process, and that it was impracticable to obtain receipts other than those attached.

I further certify that the defendant was taken before the Circuit Court Commissioner, or the judicial officer having jurisdiction under existing laws, nearest the place of arrest; and that the travel was not free, but was made with cost to the affiant.
