Abraham Whinery was born in 1795, in Tennessee, to Abraham Whinery Sr. and Martha Whinery. Abraham Sr. was born in 1765, in Orange, Columbia, Pennsylvania. Martha was born in 1766, in Orange, North Carolina. Abraham married Sarah Davidson, and they had one son: William Carroll Whinery. Abraham died in 1866, at age 71. He is buried in Bethel Cemetery, Gravette, Arkansas.
