Biographical/Historical Note

The notes in this collection discuss students living off-campus at the University of Arkansas (UA) in Fayetteville, Washington County. The University of Arkansas is located in the northwest corner of the state. It is Arkansas's land grant university and is famed for its traditions, including the unique Razorback mascot. The institution was originally named Arkansas Industrial University but changed in 1899 to the University of Arkansas, reflecting its broader academic scope. It has long been an academic and cultural mainstay in Arkansas, with its research generating a great deal of economic progress for the state and its Razorback athletic program being arguably the state's most popular.
