The President of the United States of America,

To the Marshal of the Western District of Arkansas—Greeting :

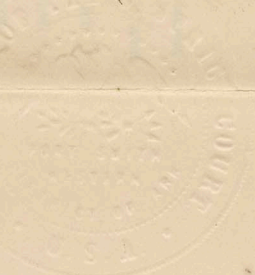
WHEREAS, at the Circuit Court of the United States of America for the Western District of Arkansas, at the August term thereof, begun and holden in Fort Smith, within and for the District aforesaid on the 27 day of August A. D. 1895, the Grand Jurors in and for said District empanelled, brought into said Court a true bill of indictment against Jayetto Walker and Jim Walker for Murder

in the Indian Country, against the Peace and Dignity of the United States, as by the said indictment, now remaining on file and of record in said Court, will more fully appear; to which indictment said Jayetto Walker and Jim Walker had not yet appeared or pleaded.

NOW, THEREFORE, You are hereby commanded, as you have heretofore been, in the name of the President of the United States of America, to apprehend said Jayetto Walker & Jim Walker and them to detain and bring before the said Court at the United States Court Room in Fort Smith, in said district, at the now term thereof to be held on the 4 day of Nov A. D. 1895, to answer said indictment.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF the honorable HENRY C. CALDWELL, Judge of the Circuit Court of the United States for the Western District of Arkansas, has caused the seal of said Court to be hereunto affixed this 27 day of Aug A. D. 1895, and in the 130 year of our independence.
