IN THE DISTRICT COURT OF THE UNITED STATES FOR THE WESTERN DISTRICT OF ARKANSAS:

MAY TERM, 1884.

Monday Morning, 9 o'clock. May 20 1884

Court met pursuant to adjournment: Present—The Honorable I. C. Parker, Judge of the District Court of the United States for the Western District of Arkansas.

Ordered by the Court that the following sums of money annexed respectively to the names of the following persons be paid them by the Marshal of this District for their fees, and compensation for services by them rendered, and travel performed, as witnesses in behalf of the United States and in behalf of defendants at the expense of the United States, in the District Court of the United States for the Western District of Arkansas, at the present term of said Court, to-wit: Amos Aldridge 16 days attendance, 157 miles travel, amount, \$ 3150
