Biographical/Historical Note

The Eureka Springs Water Company was the predecessor and parent company to the Ozarka Water Company. The brand name "Ozarka" was patented in 1905, and both companies are mentioned in this broadsheet.

Scope and Contents

This collection contains two copies of a promotional broadsheet measuring about 6x17" which contains a personal essay on the healing properties of the hot springs at Eureka Springs. The header reads "from the Kansas City Weekly Journal," and the essay is formatted like a news article, but there is no newsprint on the back, no author credited, and the footer directs readers to their local Ozarka Water Company for further questions. The date is given only as November 20, but the year is thought to be about 1920.
