This collection contains documents related to the Owens family of Arkansas. James A. Owens was born in Mississippi on November 5, 1836. He married Martha J. Goins on May 4, 1858. He enlisted in the Confederate Army on February 8, 1862, at Monticello, Arkansas.

This collection contains material related to the Owens family including a journal, a will, a receipt for the sale of an enslaved person, a school paper, and genealogy materials.
