Biographical Note

George Washington Hays served as Governor of Arkansas from 1913 to 1917. Hays was born near Camden, Arkansas, on September 23, 1863. He studied law and was admitted to the bar in 1894. By 1897, Hays opened his own law office in Camden and had married Ida Virginia Yarbrough of Ouachita County. They had two children. As a Democrat, Hays held the offices of Ouachita County Judge from 1901-1903; Circuit Judge from 1906-1913; and Governor of Arkansas from 1913 to 1917. As Governor, he supported the passage of a statewide liquor prohibition legislation that outlawed the manufacture or sell liquor in Arkansas. In 1915, the Legislature passed the plan by Hays to create a three member commission to operate the State Hospital for Nervous Diseases, the School for the Blind, the Arkansas Deaf Mute Institute, and the Confederate Home. After leaving office, Hays returned to his law practice until his death on September 15, 1927.
