Biographical Note

William Moore was the brother-in-law of Nancy Jordan Moore, the second wife of Archibald Yell. William Moore married Betsey Lawson Moore, the sister of Ann "Nancy" Jordan Moore on June 20, 1820.

Scope and Contents

This letter was written by William Moore, brother-in-law of Nancy Jordan Moore Yell, second wife of Archibald Yell, to his wife, Betsey Lawson Moore. Moore writes about settling Yell's estate. Yell perished leading a charge in the Battle of Buena Vista during the U.S. Mexican War. Moore describes Yell's uniform, "so badly cut in pieces that it barely hangs together--14 holes and splits by the lances of the Mexicans."
