Biographical/Historical Note

This collection contains a deed. A deed is a document that transfers the title to property from one owner to another. It describes the property being transferred and names all parties to the transaction. It is signed by all parties and is filed on the official record. All U.S. states require that deeds to real property be filed with the government, although the details vary. The deed was issued to J.H. Edwards for land in Polk County, Arkansas; this deed was issued by L.M. and M.J. Wimberly.
