Court met pursuant to adjournment. Present, the Hon. Isaac C. Parker, Judge of the District Court of the United States for the Western District of Arkansas.

On motion of WM. H. CLAYTON, Esq., Attorney for the Western District of Arkansas, the said defendant *Charles Brown* was brought to the bar of the Court in custody of the Marshal of said District, and it being demanded of him what he has to or can say why the sentence of the law upon *hisself* of guilty heretofore *admitted by* him by the Jury in this cause on the *3* day of *Oct* A. D. 18 *84* shall not now be pronounced against him, he says he has nothing further or other to say than he has heretofore said:

Whereupon the promises being seen, and by the Court well and sufficiently understood, it is considered by the Court that the said *Charles Brown* for his *Misdeemeanors* aforesaid, be imprisoned in the United States Jail, situated at Fort Smith, in the Western District of Arkansas for the term and period of *Thirty* days, and that he pay to the United States of America a fine of *One Hundred* Dollars, together with all their costs in and about this prosecution laid out and expended, and that they have execution therefor.

It is further considered, that the Marshal of the Western District of Arkansas, to whose custody the said *Charles Brown* is now here committed, is hereby required to receive and safely keep and convey the body of the said *Charles Brown* hence to said United States Jail, without delay, and deliver him to the custody of the Keeper of said Jail, who is hereby required to receive and safely keep the said *Charles Brown* in Jail in execution of the sentence aforesaid, and in conformity with the same, for the full period of time aforesaid. And it is further ordered that the Clerk of this Court is hereby required to furnish the Marshal of this District with two duly-certified copies of this judgment, sentence and order, one of which shall be delivered to the Keeper of said Jail, and the other returned by the Marshal to this Court, with a full and true account of the execution of the same.
