I, Dick Carr of F. Smith Ark in the County of ... and District aforesaid, being duly sworn, depose and say, that on the 30 day of April 1891 was employed under and by virtue of the third section of the act of Congress of June 14, 1858, by W. C. Phinney U. S. Deputy Marshal for said District, at my usual place of residence, as one of his posse comitatus, to assist in executing the following capias writ, to-wit:

issued by James Bongolara U. S. Commissioner for the Western District of Arkansas, within the jurisdiction of the said District, returnable to the office of said Commissioner at F. Smith Arkansas April 2 1891 and that as such posse comitatus, I immediately proceeded in company with said Marshal to

30 miles N. Muskogee I. I. - 30 miles - where we arrested Warner, former May 7 - 1891 - thence to Muskogee I. I. thence 4 miles N. Muskogee I. I. where we arrested Wm Morris May 8 - 1891 thence returning to Muskogee I. I. where we arrested J. J. Henderson May 9 - 1891 - thence

to F. Smith Ark May 13/91 before U. S. Commissioner, that no posse comitatus could have been employed at a nearer point to the place where the said Deputy informed me where he expected to find the said

to-wit:

Creek Nation I. I.

than my place of residence aforesaid; that I actually traveled from my said residence to said place of arrest, for the purposes aforesaid, 17 1/2 miles, and in the transportation of said defendants was actually and necessarily employed 6 days as set out in the foregoing account as posse comitatus, solely in the execution of said processes and transportation of said defendants as aforesaid; that I furnished the means of or actually paid for my own travel or transportation; that I have never received or been paid, or agreed to receive, or expected to be paid any other compensation, remuneration or consideration, whatever, for said expenses and 6 day's services from any other person or persons, or sources, whatever; so help me God.

Subscribed and sworn to before me this 20 day of May 1891 by the above-named Dick Carr

who personally appeared and was by me known to be the identical person he represents himself.

I, H. C. Phinney do solemnly swear that I am duly and regularly commissioned as a Deputy U. S. Marshal for said District; that the employment of a posse comitatus at Mustogee La. under the Act of Congress of June 14, 1858, was actually and indispensibly necessary to enable me to serve the warrants in my possession, and that I could not without great peril have attempted to serve the warrants entrusted to me without the assistance of a posse comitatus; that I have examined the within account and certify that the services were performed and actually rendered as therein stated, and that the amount charged therefore is just, and that I have no interest in the same.
