

Transcript of 1820 April 27: Governor William Clark, Saint Louis, [Missouri], to Governor James Miller, Quapaw Indian affairs, L.C. Gulley collection, Arkansas State Archives, Little Rock, Arkansas.

St Louis April 27th 1820

Sir

By the last mail I received a letter from the Secretary of War covering an extract of your letter to him of the 15th of Feb.y. and the inclosed Invoice of aminities due the Quapaws for 1819- Four tiercies marked agreeably to the Invoice have been received into the public store at this place, and our other tierce marked U S F Arkansas No. 2 which have been sent on to this place I presume in mistake; Thou tierces shall be fowarded in the first steamboat which decends from this place to New Orleans; to be left in store at the mouth of Arkansas River subject to your order. this is the only mode of conveyance to be met with at this place.
