Sir

I have the honor to include you
Forms which have been furnished by the
2d Comptroller, for preparing your accounts
in the Indian Department, for settlement
at this office.

Such Indian Agents as are under
your superintendence will of course be
supplied by you with the necessary forms
and instructions for starting their accounts
for your instruction and approval

When annuities are paid in merchandize,
it will be necessary to designate the
tribe or nation for whom intended, and
the year—and in the case of presents,
the names and nation of there receiving
Tribe had better be given.
Your accounts are to be rendered quarter
yearly.
