Quarter Master Genl. office,
Washington City, March 1st, 1833.

Sir,

Your letter to the Secretary of War dated the 31st of January has been referred to this office, as that to which appertains all details that relate to Military roads; and I have this day required for you a remittance of ten thousand dollars, on account of the appropriation for the road from Little Rock to St. Francis river.

The road was not assigned to this department until the 28th ult. and I have not since been able to examine into the state of the appropriations, but I will do so with as little delay as possible and cause to be remitted whatsoever balance may remain. The law requires that all monies received from the treasury be accounted for within three months from the expiration of the quarter within which it be received, Lieut. Collins will afford you all necessary aid in making up your accounts, and he will be instructed to perform any other duties in connection with the road as you may require of him.
