neighborhood of little Rock, [illegible] to the present I have received no answers, it is the South east quarter of Section thirty two, of Township three north, of the base line, in Range twelve west of the fifth principal meridian, Containing one hundred And Sixty Acres, I have the pattend of May 1812 that was granted by J. Q. Adams to Frederick Darren Son of John Darren Decd, on the 22d, May 1841 Mr Jacob Barrick through an agent paid all the taxes And other expenses that that had accrued against said land, and I have now in my possession the deed you made to said J. Barrick the 22d May/40. you will Confer a favour if you will be so kind as to inform me the situation the land is in now, and what Tax may be due on the same, and wither the land is worth any thing, is has Cost me purty high, so sown as I can ascertain I will remit the amount of money that will pay the taxes, &c – I would like if you couldent attend to it your self to recommend some one that could

in Order that I may have the same secured will you also be so kind as to write me on the subject so sown as you receive this letter or as sown as you may ascertain the situation \_\_ the land is in at present the reason that I am so urgent, I have writen three letters Sinse August, And havent received any answer when you write direct your letter to Henry Smith Waynesboro Franklin County Pennsylvania, Altho a stranger I remain with respect your Humble Servant &c
